Module Offering

Exchange students can choose from a broad range of undergraduate and graduate modules instructed in English. If your language skills meet the requirements, you are also welcome to select modules instructed in German. Your exchange coordinator will support you with your course selection. [↗](#)

Workload

The workload of a full-time student at ESB Business School is 30 ECTS credits per semester, with one credit requiring 25 – 30 hours of study. The number of credits you must acquire is determined by your home university

Exchange Coordinator

Committed to supporting you every step of the way, your first point of contact is your exchange coordinator. They are happy to advise on all the formalities and practical aspects such as enrolment, bus passes, time-table related queries and exam registration and more. [↗](#)

Student Buddy

All exchange students are assigned a local student buddy at the beginning of their stay. Your buddy helps you get settled in and is there to answer any questions you may have during your stay.

Welcome Session and Leisure Activities

To help exchange students find their way around campus, manage the initial paper work and meet fellow students, a welcome session and leisure activities are organized at the beginning of each semester. Throughout your stay you will also be able to take part in a range of social and cultural activities.

Language Tandem

The Reutlingen International Office (RIO) operates a language tandem programme which is a good way for you to acquire or improve your language skills with a local student in return for teaching them some of your own language.

Where can I live?

Finding a home where you can sit back and relax is vital for a balanced student life. There are various options for you to choose from.



On-campus:

Many local and international students opt to live in the halls of residence, the majority of which are located on or close to the campus. It's a perfect way to meet other students and settle in quickly.

You can choose between furnished single rooms with communal kitchen and bathroom and individual flatlets. [↗](#)

Off-campus:

You may prefer to live off-campus in private accommodation such as a shared apartment (Wohngemeinschaft) or studio. Various portals and platforms are available to help you with your search. Your exchange coordinator will provide more information on accommodation once your application is completed.

Estimated monthly living costs:

You can expect to spend 750€ - 950€ per month for food, transportation, rent and leisure activities depending on accommodation and your personal lifestyle.

What do former exchange students say?




Niak from Taiwan: "The exchange programme allowed me to meet international students and helped me to understand the importance of language and interpersonal skills."
